
here in person, to meet our students and staff, and to share with you why we are all so passionate about this remarkable school.






# 'A CATHOLIC SCHOOL THAT WELCOMES ALL'

### ADMISSIONS - NEXT STEPS

#### **APPLICATION**

When you feel that Ratcliffe College is a strong possible choice for your child, we would encourage you to complete the online application form.

#### APPLICATION FORM

The Admissions Team will contact your child's current school for a reference, which will be considered alongside the assessment or examination.

#### **ENTRANCE EXAMINATIONS**

Entrance Examinations normally take place in the January or February, before the September your child is due to start with us.

#### **△** OFFER OF PLACE

We aim to inform you of the outcome of your application within two weeks of the assessment. An offer is made by letter from the Headmaster, accompanied by acceptance paperwork.

#### ACCEPTANCE OF PLACE

On accepting the offer of a place, payment of your deposit along with final paperwork will secure your child's place.

### SCHOLARSHIPS

Ratcliffe College offers a wide range of Scholarships to recognise academic, sporting, musical, dramatic and artistic talent amongst students for the Senior School.

We have the highest expectations of our Scholarship students; challenging each of them to fulfil their potential in all their endeavours. Scholarships are normally awarded on entry to Year 7 and Year 12, and can be awarded within the range of 5-20% of the school fee.

### **BURSARIES**

As a Catholic School our aim is to help children who, under normal circumstances, would not be able to benefit from a Ratcliffe education. Bursaries are available for up to 80% of a student's School Fee and in exceptional circumstances up to 100%. All awards are subject to parental means testing. For those entering Years 7 or 12, bursaries are allocated annually, following interview and assessment of any perceived and noteworthy talent, and a formal application for bursarial assistance, which includes parental means testing.

## SCHOOL BUS SERVICE

The school currently operates several bus services bringing in students from a wide area, using coach service and both school vehicles. The route details can be found on the school website but cover generally: South and East of Leicester, two routes from Nottingham, East Bridgford and West Bridgford, North Leicestershire Charnwood Villages and one route through the Vale of Belvoir.

Our aim is to have all students in school for 08:20am. Buses depart after the end of the extended school day at 6:20pm, to allow full participation in our extensive programme of co-curricular activities

The College is easily accessible. Situated in the East Midlands, on the A46 seven miles north of Leicester, close to the towns of Loughborough and Melton Mowbray and the city of Nottingham, Ratcliffe College is conveniently located for the national motorway network.

## VISIT US

The best way for you to get a feel of life at Ratcliffe College is to come see us in person. We offer a range of experiences to visit us:

#### **OPEN MORNINGS**

Our twice-yearly Open Mornings take place during September and March each year, these public events are useful if you are looking to get a taste of the college, tour the grounds and speak to teachers. These events are relaxed and informal and provide the opportunity to ask any questions you might have and pick up any important information you might need.

#### **TASTER DAYS**

Your child may wish to spend a Taster Day at Ratcliffe on a normal school day either prior to taking the Entrance Examination or Assessment or after being offered a place with us. We find this works very well in terms of each child becoming familiar with the school grounds and classrooms, the daily schedule, the content of lessons and how they are delivered, the personalities of teachers and children at the school and generally the overall culture of the school.

#### **ONE TO ONE VISIT**

We offer a personal visit experience for you and your child. This will include an introduction from the Headmaster and a short tour of the school with an existing pupil. These events are usually provided for those who are looking at registering their child and have specific questions about the entrance examinations and admissions process, or just want to find out more about life and boarding at Ratcliffe. These events are organised at a time that best suits you and corresponds suitably with school timetabling and staff availability.

#### **SIXTH FORM EVENINGS AND TASTER DAYS**

We also host specific Sixth Form Evenings and termly taster days which are designed for those looking to join us for Year 12 and Year 13 during the A-level period. These events provide a bespoke and personal experience for you. We would suggest booking online in advance to visit Ratcliffe College.
